BIG WIN AT CAMP PENDLETON

Richard Brady & Associates, as a subcontractor to RQ Construction, has been awarded a **\$5,977,555** contract for design and construction services. The contract will fund the rehabilitation and reconstruction of twelve sewer lift stations at Marine Corps Base Camp Pendleton. The work will involve both electrical and instrumentation upgrades to nine stations, demolition of six stations, construction of three new stations, and construction of approximately 6,500 feet of new gravity sewer lines. The contract duration is 575 days. Jet Construction, of Oceanside, California, is the primary subcontractor to Richard Brady & Associates. This is a 100% SET-ASIDE FOR SMALL BUSINESS with a North American Industrial Classification Systems (NAICS) OF 722310. One indefinite quantity, indefinite delivery contract is anticipated to be awarded as a result of this solicitation. The government will guarantee a minimum order of 25 cases monthly. The maximum number of cases per month will not exceed 100 cases per month. The term of the contract is from date of award through September 30, 2006. The contract will have four one-year options, for the period of date of award through September 2010. This announcement constitutes the only solicitation; quotations are being accepted until a representative solicitation document will not be issued.
